



RE. Tree Preservation order No. 2 2005 Litchard Mission Church, Bridgend

I am writing in response to the application for a tree preservation order applying to the tree on our land on Taylor Road

The application for a preservation order was made after we, as a church, made a decision to fell or replace the tree for safety reasons. I must therefore, on behalf of the church, object to the preservation order and ask that it be withdrawn.

The car park at Litchard Mission church is very busy, being used: on a Sunday when attendance is over 200 for the 2 services; on a Tuesday morning when mums bring toddlers from throughout the community to a popular and busy Mums and Toddlers group and 40+ people come to a prayer meeting in the evening; on a Wednesday when in excess of 50 retired people meet for a coffee morning, and up to 60 children age 5 to 11 come to the children's meetings, and play in it; on a Thursday when 30 comprehensive age children met and play football on it; and on a Saturday once a month when a group for visually handicapped people hold a service in the church.

The tree is large and overhangs both the car park for the church, and the footpath and highway of Taylor Road. It sheds branches and needles all year round, and during the summer months sheds large amounts of cones. These are a serious hazard for the elderly or the very young when accessing the car park, and for the children's groups when playing games on the car park. The car park is also accessed by youth not attached to the church when the building is secured, and complaints have been made to us about youth over whom we have no control, throwing cones at passing cars. This danger from the cones also exists over the pavement and highway. A car on Taylor Road has also been damaged by youth throwing stones at a football stuck in the branches.

The tree is also used by youth who hang around at night and occupy the telephone box

For all of these reasons we would like to be free to fell the tree to protect those using the car park, and passers by and we would urge you to consider the impact that this order will have.

We only want to fell the tree in the interests of safety, and so respectfully we must ask that should the order be upheld, the council take full responsibility for any accidents or injuries caused by the tree and its needles and cones, as we will not be able to prevent them.
