MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL(PLASNEWYDD STREET, MAESTEG)(RESIDENTS' PARKING PLACES) ORDER, 1977

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 28(1) and 31(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act, 1972 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other enabling powers, and with the consent of every authority and person responsible for the maintenance of the roads affected by the Order and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C (1) of the Act of 1967 hereby make the following Order:-

P A R T IG E N E R A L

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 2nd day of September, 1977 and may be cited as "Mid Glamorgan County Council (Plasnewydd Street, Maesteg) (Residents' Parking Places) Order, 1977".
2. (i) In this Order:-
 - "driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;
 - "dual purpose vehicle" has the same meaning as in Schedule 5 to the Act of 1967;
 - "goods vehicle" means a motor vehicle not exceeding 30 cwt unladen weight which is constructed or adapted for use for the carriage of goods or burden of any description, and is not drawing a trailer;
 - "motor cycle" and "invalid carriage" have the same meanings as in section 99 of the Act of 1967;
 - "owner", in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;
 - "parking place" means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place;
 - "passenger vehicle" means a motor vehicle (other than a motor cycle or an invalid carriage) constructed solely for the carriage of passengers and their effects and adapted to carry not more than twelve passengers exclusive of the driver, and not drawing a trailer;
 - "permit" means a permit issued under the provision of Article 11 of this Order;
 - "permit holder" means a person to whom a permit has been issued under the provisions of Article 11 of this Order;
 - "permitted hours" means at all time;
 - "the 1964 Regulations" means the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions 1964; and
 - "resident" means a person whose usual residence is at premises the postal address of which is in any road or part of a road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order.
- (ii) The Interpretation Act, 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

AUTHORISATION AND USE OF PARKING PLACES

3. (i) The parts of the road specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 of this Order is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for the parking during the permitted hours, and in such positions as are specified in relation to that road in the said Schedule, of such classes of vehicles, also so specified, as display in the manner specified in Article 15 of this Order a valid permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle.
(ii) Nothing in paragraph (i) of this Article shall restrict the power of the Council to close any parking place.
4. Where in Schedule 1 to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is:
 - (a) of the specified class; or, as the case may be,
 - (b) in the specified position.
5. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place -
 - (a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons, or so as to be a nuisance;
 - (b) when the Council has closed that parking place.
6. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
7. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.
8. When a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Article 4 or Article 5 of this Order, a person authorised by the Council to do so may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be removed from that parking place: Provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provision of Article 4(b) of this Order, a person authorised by the Council to do so may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position shall comply with that provision.
9. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of Article 8 of this Order may do so in such manner as he thinks necessary.
10. When a person authorised by the Council removes or makes arrangements for the removal of a vehicle from a parking place by virtue of Article 8 of this Order, he shall make such arrangements as may be reasonably necessary for the safe custody of the vehicle.
11. (i) Any resident who is the owner of a passenger vehicle, a dual purpose vehicle, a goods vehicle, an invalid carriage or a motor cycle, may apply to the Council for the issue of a permit for the parking of that vehicle in a parking place and

- any such application shall be made on a form issued by and obtainable from the Council and shall include the particulars and information required by such form.
- (ii) The Council may require an applicant for a permit to produce to an officer of the Council such evidence in respect of the application as they may reasonably require to verify any particulars of information given to them.
- (iii) The Council, upon being satisfied that an applicant is a resident and is the owner of a vehicle of a class specified in paragraph (1) of this Article, may issue to that applicant:-
- (a) one permit for the parking during the permitted hours in a parking place of the vehicle to which such permit relates by the owner or by any person using such vehicle with the consent of the owner (other than a person to whom such vehicle has been let for hire or reward): Provided that, subject to the provisions of Article 13 of this Order, the Council shall not issue a permit to any resident which would be valid for any period to which any other permit issued to that resident extends; and
 - (b) one protective cover for the display of the permit.
2. (i) A permit holder may surrender a permit to the Council at any time and shall surrender a permit to the Council on the occurrence of any of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
- (ii) The Council may, by notice in writing served on the permit holder at the address shown by that person on the application for the permit or at any other address believed to be that person's residence, withdraw a permit if it appears to the Council that any of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article has occurred, and the permit holder shall surrender the permit to the Council within 48 hours of the receipt of the said notice.
- (iii) The events referred to in the foregoing provisions of this Article are:-
- (a) the permit holder ceasing to be a resident;
 - (b) the permit holder ceasing to be the owner of the vehicle in respect of which the permit was issued;
 - (c) the vehicle in respect of which such permit was issued being adapted or used in such a manner that it is not a vehicle of a class specified in Article 11 of this Order;
 - (d) the issue of a duplicate permit by the Council under the provisions of Article 13 of this Order; or
 - (e) the expiry of the period for which the permit was issued.
- (iv) A permit shall cease to be valid on the occurrence of any one of the events set out in paragraph (3) of this Article.
13. (i) If a permit is mutilated or defaced or the figures or particulars on it have become illegible or the colour of the permit has become altered by fading or otherwise, the permit holder shall surrender it to the Council and may then apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate permit.
- (ii) If a permit is lost or destroyed, the permit holder may apply to the Council for the issue to him of a duplicate permit.
- (iii) The provisions of this Order shall apply to a duplicate permit and an application for such a permit as if it were a permit or, as the case may be, an application for a permit.
- (iv) Any permit issued by virtue of the provisions of paragraph (1) or (2) of this Article shall be marked as a duplicate, and upon the issue of a duplicate permit, the permit which it duplicates shall become invalid.

14. A permit shall be in writing and shall include the following particulars:-
- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle in respect of which the permit has been issued;
 - (b) the period during which, subject to the provisions of Article 12(4) of this Order, the permit shall remain valid; and
 - (c) an authentication that the permit has been issued by the Council.
15. At all times during which a vehicle is left in a parking place during the permitted hours there shall be displayed in the protective cover referred to in Article 11 of this Order on the front of the vehicle a valid permit issued in respect of that vehicle so that all the particulars referred to in Article 14 of this Order are readily visible from outside the vehicle.
16. When a permit has been displayed on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of Article 15 of this Order, no person shall remove the permit from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver of the vehicle.

(RESIDENTS' PARKING PLACES) (VARIATION) ORDER, 1978

The Mid Glamorgan County Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council") in exercise of their powers under Sections 28(1), 31(1) and 84D(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968 and Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act, 1972 (which said Act of 1967 as so amended is hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1967"), and of all other enabling powers, and with the consent of every authority and person responsible for the maintenance of the road affected by the Order and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Section 84C (1) of the Act of 1967 hereby make the following Order:-

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 7th day of July 1978 and may be cited as the "Mid Glamorgan County Council (Plasnewydd Street, Maesteg) (Residents' Parking Places) (Variation) Order, 1978".

2. (i) In this Order:-

"parking place" means any part of a road authorised as a Parking Place by the "Mid Glamorgan County Council (Plasnewydd Street Maesteg) (Residents' Parking Places) Order, 1977".

"permit" means a permit issued under the provision of Article 11 of the "Mid Glamorgan County Council (Plasnewydd Street, Maesteg) (Residents' Parking Places) Order, 1977".

"permitted hours" means at all time, and

"resident" means a person whose usual residence is at premises the postal address of which is in Plasnewydd Street, Maesteg;

(ii) The Interpretation Act, 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. The "Mid Glamorgan County Council (Plasnewydd Street, Maesteg) (Residents' Parking Places) Order, 1977" (which in Article 3(i) thereof, and subject to the provisions following thereafter, authorises the part of the road specified in column 1 of Schedule 1 of the said Order to be used as a parking place for the parking during the permitted hours, and in such positions as are specified in relation to that road in the said Schedule, of such classes of vehicles, also so specified, as display in the manner specified in Article 15 thereof a valid permit issued by the Council in respect of that vehicle) shall have effect save that nothing contained in Articles 3 and 4 of the said Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in the part of road referred to for so long as may be necessary to enable:-

- (a) a person to board or alight from the vehicle;
- (b) goods to be loaded onto and unloaded from a vehicle;
- (c) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such

purpose in any other road, to be used in connection with any of the following operations, namely:-

- (i) building, industrial or demolition operations;
- (ii) the removal of any obstruction to traffic;
- (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the said road ;
- (iv) the laying, erection, alteration or repair in, or in land adjacent to the said road of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity or of any telegraphic line as defined in the Telegraph Act, 1878;

- (d) the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road, to be used in the service of a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;

- (e) the vehicle to be loaded or unloaded in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwellinghouse adjacent to the Residents' Parking Place to another office or dwellinghouse or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository.

- (f) medical practitioners or veterinary surgeons, to visit premises adjacent to Residents' Parking Places provided the vehicle is displaying an appropriately worded notice to the effect that it is being used while "on call";

- (g) (i) any vehicle owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles to be used as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral;
- (ii) a maximum of 3 vehicles to be used in connection with a wedding

- (h) any vehicle to be used for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes;

- (i) vehicles to be used for building and maintenance purposes in properties adjacent to a Residents Parking Place;
