It has been added to (hence the plus) because, originally written to map the needs of children and young people, it now also includes needs of families. It includes the 4 tiers of need (from basic needs through additional and complex to critical needs); five (plus one) dimensions of need (social, physical, emotional, cultural and learning needs plus economic); and 6 outcomes which we would want all to enjoy: learn and achieve; participate and enjoy; give and receive respect; be healthy; be safe, and be confident and self-reliant.
