MARGAM CREMATORIUM

1. Purpose of the Report

1.1 The purpose of this report is to inform the Joint Committee of the implications on the crematorium from the temporary closure of Margam Crematorium

2. Background

- 2.1 The details of the incident at Margam were reported to the last meeting of the Joint Committee on 6th September 2013 (Minute No. 42 refers).
- 2.2 Margam is currently closed and will open once new cremators are fitted and commissioned.

3. Currrent Situation/Proposal

- 3.1 Margam Crematorium are currently negotiating with contractors and it is unlikely that it will be open before March 2014. Therefore, the demand for cremations at Coychurch Crematorium throughout the winter period will be noticeable increased from the previous year.
- 3.2 The comparison number of cremations between 2012 and 2013 are indicated below with a projection for forthcoming months:-

- 3.3 The annual income projections will be affected by this additional usage and it is anticipated that the income projection for cremations will increase from £880,000 to £1,077,000, an increase from 2012/13 of £197,000.
- 3.3 The Joint Committee will recall that there was a decrease in cremations when the Vale of Glamorgan Crematorium was opened in 2010. The increased demand can be accommodated at Coychurch Crematorium and current industry practices will assist in reducing delays to families.

- 6.1 Any income generated from additional cremations will increase the level of financial reserves
