- 1. Purpose of Report.
- 1.1 On 30 September 2016, an application for a Review of the Premises Licence was submitted by the Chief Officer of Police in relation to the premises known as Cabin Bar & Breeze Nightclub Coney Beach Porthcawl.
- 2. Connection to Corporate Improvement Plan / Other Corporate Priority.
- 2.1 None.
- 3. Background.
- 3.1 A copy of the application and supporting documentation is attached at Appendix A. There is a confidential section of this report containing information submitted by the Chief Officer of Police which is attached at Appendix A1.
- 3.2 The Premises Licence Holder is Patrick Evans. The Premises Licence authorises the following licensable activities during standard times as follows:

Supply of alcohol, and regulated entertainment

Monday to Saturday: 1000 to 0200 hours

Sunday: 1200 to 0030 hours

Late night refreshment Monday to Saturday: 2300 to 0200 hours Sunday 2300 to 0030 hours

A copy of the Premises Licence will be available at the meeting.

4. Current situation / proposal.

- 4.1 The application has been advertised in accordance with the regulations. Representations have been received from the premises licence holder's representative, Blackford's LLP which are attached at Appendix B.
- 4.2 At the time of preparing this report the Licensing Section was not aware of any further discussions or exchange of documents between the South Wales Police and the Premises Licence Holder but an update will be provided to the Committee at the start of the hearing. The authority must hold a hearing to determine this application, to consider the application and any relevant representations received.

- 5.1 None.
- 6. Equality Impact Assessment.
- 6.1 A full Equality Impact Assessment has not been undertaken in relation to this service, however due regard has been given to the implications on persons protected by equality legislation and human rights. The application for a review is based on the persistent and prolonged failure to promote those objectives.

THE DESIGNATED PREMISES SUPERVISOR (DPS)

Karl Svensen is the holder of a personal licence and has been the Designated Premises Supervisor (DPS) since **20th October 2014**.

THE PREMISES

The premises consists of a large open plan L-shaped ground floor area known as the Cabin Bar which has a capacity of 200 and a first floor nightclub above called Breeze which reopened in the summer of **2015** and can accommodate 140 customers.

It is located at the main entrance to Coney Beach fairground.

There is also a ground floor external patio area at the entrance to the Cabin Bar which abuts the thoroughfare into the fairground and overlooks Coney Beach.

THE PREMISES LICENCE

Section 51 and 87

It is important that the Licensing Sub-Committee familiarise themselves with the licence and its conditions briefly however; the hours of opening for both premises are: -

Monday to Saturday: 10.30 - 02.30 hours

Sunday: 12.00 - 01.00 hours Good Friday: 12.00 - 00.30 hours

Sunday preceding a Bank Holiday Monday: 12.00 - 02.30 hours

These are some of the longest opening hours within the county borough.

BRIDGEND COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL'S "STATEMENT OF LICENSING POLICY"

Section 12 refers to REVIEWS OF LICENCES:

Sub-section 12.1 "Reviews of Premises Licences represent a key protection for the community in respect of problems during the term of a Premises Licence."

HOME OFFICE GUIDANCE UNDER SECTION 182 OF THE LICENSING ACT

Section 11 relates to REVIEWS and highlights THE REVIEW PROCESS

- 11.1 The proceedings set out in the 2003 Act for reviewing premises licences represent a key protection for the community where problems associated with the licensing objectives occur after the grant or variation of a premises licence.
- 11.2 At any stage, following the grant of a premises licence, a responsible authority, or any other person, may ask the licensing authority to review the licence because of a matter arising at the premises in connection with any of the four licensing objectives.

OFFENCES COMMITTED UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003

- 1) Section 136: -
- A) Carry on or attempt to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premises otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation i.e. a premises licence and the conditions which form part of it

THE LICENSING OBJECTIVES

The Prevention of Crime & Disorder

There are numerous, persistent and an unacceptable number of incidents linked to the premises and many of these occurrences have resulted in injury to customers, some severe, where alcohol has paid a prominent part.

Customers have had to be forcibly handcuffed, whilst one was so violent that he had to be subdued with the use of a taser weapon i.e. what is commonly referred to as "tasered".

In the last few months a number of police officers summoned to deal with disturbances have also been assaulted.

The most serious offences have also been committed under the Licensing Act 2003.

Similarly serious offences have been detected under other legislation which is appended to the application.

Infact the list of incidents associated with the premises highlights that it has an extended history of violence and disorder.

These occurrences seriously impact on the licensing objectives and South Wales Police are therefore of the opinion that the only course of action which will promote the objectives is to review the licence.

The occurrences and offences recorded to date are totally unacceptable and even if they were to remain burstant a review is warranted however; they have increased since **2014** and will increase further unless drastic changes take place.

Since **Karl Svensen** became DPS in late **2014** and the nightclub reopened in **July 2015**, having been closed for a number of years as it had fallen into disrepair, there has been an increase in alcohol related violent crime and disorder.

Additionally the licensing objectives have been further and seriously undermined by events during the latest Elvis festival.

From **2015** up to and including **September 2016** numerous occurrences have been reported many of which have subsequently been recorded as criminal offences e.g.: -

Drunk & Disorderly conduct
Assaults Occasioning Actual Bodily Harm
Possession of an offensive weapon
Fighting
Theft
Drunkenness

It is also significant that customers have become very violent and many have been so intoxicated on arrest that custody officers have had to conduct regular 30 minute welfare visits to the cells to monitor their demeanour.

Custody records detail that prisoners are still drunk many hours after arrest and visits have taken place from the commencement of their detention until their release many hours after their arrival at the police station.

Public Safety

This objective is seriously compromised due to the number of recorded crimes which involve the use of violence.

The Prevention of Public Nuisance

This objective is similarly compromised due to the volume of calls reported where incidents have occurred within the premises and in the vicinity.

ENGAGEMENT

South Wales Police have engaged in different approaches to promote the licensing objectives including warning/advice letters and meetings. There has infact been two letters served recently.

There was also a failed attempt by the police to convene a meeting at Bridgend Police Station in **July 2016** to address matters.

However; the two meetings which have taken place as well as the letters served have had no impact and incidents involving drunken, violent customers as well as other serious occurrences continue to be recorded.

It therefore leaves South Wales Police with no other alternative than to review the premises licence in order to reduce crime and disorder and public nuisance associated with both venues and promote public safety.

First meeting with the DPS

On **4**th **August 2015** a meeting was held at Bridgend Police Station with **Karl Svensen** and the divisional licensing officer who highlighted the serious concerns of the police relating to alcohol related violent assaults which had taken place at the premises.

Mr Svensen was advised to monitor the external areas and report incidents to the police as quickly as possible including those involving patrons who have been ejected.

However; despite the meeting a further 6 occurrences relating to assault and disturbance were reported during the month of August alone i.e. 8th (two incidents), 9th, 16th, 28th and 29th.

Second meeting with the DPS

Upon receipt of the warning of 13th July 2016 the DPS contacted the Licensing Department proposing to arrange a meeting as he was displeased with the content of the letter and denied that there were problems at the premises.

This was despite the fact that he refused to attend the meeting in July.

An appointment was facilitated by Inspector Drew at Bridgend Police Station on **10**th **August 2016** which also involved Divisional Licensing officers however; neither Pat Evans nor his representative attended.

It is highly significant that officers voiced the same serious concerns as those highlighted a year previously however; in essence very little had changed.

Despite the meeting serious matters were subsequently evidenced during a joint agency enforcement operation at the Porthcawl Elvis weekend in **September 2016**.

WARNING/ADVICE LETTERS SERVED ON THE LICENCE HOLDER AND DPS BY SOUTH WALES POLICE

South Wales Police served letters on both **Mr Evans** and **Mr Svensen** on **8**th **June 2016** which gave rise to a written response from Nicholas Pounder, the legal manager of Coney Beach amusements, dated **17**th **June 2016**.

Despite the letter and the reply there were reported disturbances, assaults, including sexual assault and a "glassing" recorded on 12th, 18th, 19th June as well as 1st, 2nd and 6th July 2016.

Further failures to promote the objectives resulted in a second letter being served on 13th July 2016.

As with the first letter the second document had no impact as occurrences and offences were recorded thereafter.

As a consequence of the correspondence in **June** coupled with the number and severity of incidents of violence, many of which were alcohol related, Inspector 3675 Drew, Communities & Partnerships, attempted arrange a meeting with the management of the premises and their legal adviser in order to address the concerns of senior officers.

A date of **Friday 22**nd **July 2016** was mutually agreed however; management refused to attend at Bridgend Police Station with Mr Pounder giving the following reason by e-mail, "Nor (I would suggest) is it appropriate that this meeting, which you have called concerning a matter in which we bear no blame, takes place in Bridgend Police Station".

Officers were invited to attend the venue instead and a meeting did not take place.

Since this date occurrences have been recorded and indeed on the same day of the scheduled meeting yet another alcohol related assault took place.

The incident again highlighted that a customer's intake of alcohol was excessive and played a significant part in the assault.

Officers had become so concerned with the demeanor of clientele that a transport van was positioned outside the venue to observe the behaviour of customers leaving after closure and act as a deterent.

At 02.30hrs on Saturday 23rd July 2016 (Friday trading) customers became involved in a disturbance upon leaving causing officers to alight from the vehicle and intervene in an attempt to part the factions. Sergeant 4717 Davies was taken to the ground where he was punched in the face by a customer who, after a struggle, was eventually arrested and handcuffed. He was very intoxicated. Infact he is the fifth police officer to be assaulted by drunken customers in 3 separate occurrences in recent months and these facts are unprecedented. CONCLUSION In order to promote the licensing objectives South Wales Police feel that there is no alternative but to review the licence given the seriousness and persistence of the reported incidents and crimes. These concerns are strengthened given that advice and warnings have been given and meetings held yet there continues to be a failure to promote the objectives. Infact the management are in denial of what is regularly occurring. The situation is further compounded by the serious events which took place at the Elvis Festival which clearly demonstrates that management cannot hold positions of responsibility at a licensed venue. As previously highlighted reviews represent a key protection for the community in respect of problems which arise during the term of an authorisation. The guidance dictates that licensing authorities, the police and other law enforcement agencies will use the review procedures effectively to deter criminal activities. South Wales Police suggest that the situation will not change and feel that the only option open which would address the failures and promote the objectives is to review the Premises Licence. RE: OFFENCES UNDER THE LICENSING ACT 2003

Cabin Bar & Breeze Night Club, Coney Beach, Eastern Promenade, Porthcawl

At about 02.15 hours on 30th April 2016 a fight took place outside your premises involving customers and when police officers were called to the scene the incident deteriorated into a serious disturbance.

A number of officers and a member of the public were assaulted and two were customers arrested.

South Wales Police recognise that security staff assisted officers in the detention of suspects however; enquiries into this matter highlight a number of concerns.

5 requests were made to either Karl Svensen, Designated Premises Supervisor, or other staff members for CCTV images of the incident.

Not only have staff failed to produce CCTV but some on duty staff were unable to operate the CCTV system in contravention of the following conditions of Premises Licence BCBCLP028: -

Annex 2 - Conditions Consistent with the Operating Schedule
The prevention of crime and disorder:-

- 1. The Premises Licence Holder shall retain and maintain the installation of CCTV at the premises to the satisfaction of the South Wales Police Crime Reduction Officer.
- 5. There will be a storage facility of CCTV images of up to thirty one days covering the maximum number of days in a calendar month.
- 6. The Premises Licence Holder must make recordings of images available on request to any officer of the South Wales Police in the course of their duties as soon, as is reasonably practicable. Therefore adequate training will have to be provided to duty staff in order to comply with this condition

Section 136 of the Licencing Act creates an offence of: -

A) Carrying on or attempting to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premise otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation i.e. a premises licence and the conditions which form part of it

OR

B) Knowingly allowing a licensable activity to be so carried on

The offences in respect of the above are considered so serious that the penalties are: -

- 1) An unlimited fine and/or a term of imprisonment on summary conviction not exceeding 6 months.
- 2) All alcohol and containers may be forfeited and destroyed.
- 3) The Premises Licence may be reviewed under Section 51.
- 4) Suspension or forfeiture of a Personal Licence.

You should be aware that South Wales Police has successfully made numerous applications under the review procedure to suspend and/or revoke licences.

Section 53A of the Act, inserted by section 21 of the Violent Crime Reduction Act 2006, also allows a quick process for attaching interim conditions to a licence and a fast track licence review when the police consider that the premises concerned is associated with serious crime or serious disorder.

Section 76 of the Anti-Social Crime & Policing Act 2014 authorises closure of premises to prevent public nuisance or disorder.

Interrogation of incidents in recent months highlight a number of assaults and disturbances whereby alcohol played a significant part.

The sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk is contrary to Section 141 of the Act.

Another serious incident took place at about 23.30 hours on 3rd April 2016 and offences of Grievous Bodily Harm and Common Assault were recorded

The former offence was particularly grave and resulted in the victim sustaining horrific injuries in the form of two fractured eye sockets, a broken nose and fractured jaw.

On this occasion there was a delay in supplying CCTV images again in contravention of the conditions.

You must remedy the situation immediately and adhere to the conditions of your Premises Licence and we also strongly urge you to be more diligent when serving/admitting customers or face appropriate enforcement action.

Under Section 185 of the Licensing Act 2003 concerning the investigation of a complaint in respect of licensed premises, a copy of this correspondence will also be disclosed to the Licensing Authority.

CABIN BAR & BREEZE NIGHTCLUB, EASTER PROMENADE, PORTHCAWL CF32 5TS

Further to my recent letter it has come to my attention that another serious incident has occurred at your venue and the investigating officer has reported that CCTV images could not be supplied when requested.

PC 5793 Roberts attended at the premises and spoke to the manageress, in an attempt to secure CCTV images concerning an assault which occurred at Breeze nightclub on Saturday 2nd July 2016 (i.e. Friday night).

Mrs. stated that she was unable to access CCTV and the only staff member that could operate the system was not due to return to work until Monday 11th July.

This is in contravention of licence condition 6: -

The Premises Licence Holder must make recordings of images available on request to any officer of the South Wales Police in the course of their duties as soon, as is reasonably practicable. Therefore adequate training will have to be provided to duty staff in order to comply with this condition

In other words staff who are performing their duties must be properly trained and therefore able to provide officers with CCTV images when they are requested to do so.

This is a formal request to you as premises licence holder to provide copies of the CCTV footage for the following date and times: -

From 00.00 hours to 00.30 hours on Saturday 2nd July 2016.

Under Section 136 it is an offence to: -

A) Carry on or attempt to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premise otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation i.e. a premises licence and the conditions which form part of it

Or

B) Knowingly allow a licensable activity to be so carried on

The offences in respect of the above are considered so serious that the penalties are: -

- 1) An unlimited fine and/or a term of imprisonment on summary conviction not exceeding 6 months.
- 2) All alcohol and containers may be forfeited and destroyed.
- 3) The Premises Licence may be reviewed under Section 51.
- 4) Suspension or forfeiture of a Personal Licence.

Additionally perusal of the *Licensed Premises Management System (LPMS)* highlights that a considerable number of incidents have been reported to the police which have occurred either at or where there is a causal link to the premises.

Very many of these incidents concern assaults, fighting and disorderly behaviour which are alcohol related.

Infact numerous customers have been so intoxicated on arrest that when visited by staff their custody records detail that they have been found to be still drunk many hours after their arrival at the police station.

Section 141 of the Act creates an offence of - The sale of alcohol to a person who is drunk.

South Wales Police strongly advise you to take appropriate steps to reduce the number of alcohol related occurrences and comply with the conditions of your authorisation.

Cabin Bar & Breeze Night Club, Coney Beach, Porthcawl

Thank you for your letter of the 8th of June addressed to Mr Patrick Evans (received on the 14th). We trust you had our email of the 15th confirming that we were immediately investigating the matter.

I met with Mr Evans and Mr Karl Svensen (Designated Premises Supervisor and our tenant) yesterday evening to discuss fully the serious allegations and comments in your letter. Our enquiries have enabled us to reply as follows:

- Neither incidents to which you refer (3rd and 30th of April) are recorded in the incident Log at
 the public house. They keep accurate records and events such as these, certainly of the
 severity you describe, would have been noted. Your officers are welcome to check;
- 2. There is no evidence to suggest that the culprits in either incident were patrons of our establishments. You say the incident on the 30th of April occurred "outside" the premises. With respect, we are not responsible for events which have arisen beyond our licensed areas (unless of course they are our patrons) this area (outside the public house) is effectively a thoroughfare linking Porthcawl town centre to destinations to the east of Coney Beach, for example Trecco Bay, the Hi Tide and beyond. As for the incident on the 3rd of April your letter falls to identify at all where that occurred;
- 3. Further, and in any event, it is not accepted by Mr Svensen that there were "5 requests made" for CCTV images of the incident (30th April). As I am sure you and your colleagues are aware, Mr Svensen runs a very responsible establishment and he of course is the proprietor of Bluestone Security Services (www.bluestonesacurityservices.co.uk) which has its offices at the premises. It is a highly respected company with the highest accreditations which are displayed on its website. However, the facts we have from Mr Svensen are that:
 - There is a remote back up of all CCTV images via 'Secure it' which would have been made available;

- If he had been unavailable to locate the images then his staff would have contacted him immediately – he is available at all times either in person or on the telephone.
- I am also told that the first request was made 32 days after the (first) incident which
 is outside the normal 31 day memory cycle of such recordings;
- d. In any event the external areas are extensively covered by CCTV from the cameras erected by Coney Beach. No request was ever received by Mr Evans for his recordings of either incident
- e. Mr Svensen and his firm have assisted the police on innumerable occasions in handling difficult situations outside their immediate areas of responsibility and allegations of this type are very disappointing.
- 4. In summary we do not accept there have been any breaches of the terms and conditions of our Premises Licence albeit we are prepared to discuss with our officers any aspect of this letter, or generally, which may assist in improving matters in the future.

believe he was going to assault me or Pc 4699 Dobson. This male was stood in my personal space, waving the handcuff in my direction. He continued to struggle with Pc 4699 Dobson and I was now fearful that Pc 4699 Dobson was going to be assaulted by this male.

This male was of a muscular build and appeared very agitated. In my opinion, he was heavily under the influence of alcohol and drugs as his behaviour was so aggressive and irrational. Both his fists were clenched and I could see that the top bar on the handcuff was open and potentially it could have caused serious injury to myself or any of my colleagues.

I drew my Taser and shouted at the male, "OFFICER WITH TASER, STOP STRUGGLING". I aimed the red dot on the males' stomach area and again shouted the instruction "STOP STRUGGLING TASER TASER".

The male continued to struggle so I discharged a cartridge from approximately two feet away. I believed the top barb connected the male's stomach area although I don't believe the bottom barb connected as the Taser deployment had no affect. I fired a five second cycle, but it had no Effect on the male. I believe the bottom barb may have made contact with the loose handcuff on his right wrist, hence the Taser having no effect on the male. I saw the male pull the top barb from his body before managing to escape and run towards the general direction of Porthcawl Fire Station when he appeared to trip over and stumble.

I saw the male pull the top barb from his stomach area and pull a silver coloured knuckle duster from his person. At this point, he is still armed with a handcuff on his right wrist, with the top bar open and potentially lethal.

As he got up off the floor, this male again started waving the handcuff in the air towards the direction of the Officers. The male was eventually detained by myself, Pc 4699 Dobson and Pc 4400 Thomas. We also received assistance from a member of the Cabin Public House door staff.

As we detained this male, the knuckle duster that he had in his possession had fallen out of his hand and onto the floor. I recall Pc 4400 Thomas shouting **"KNUCKLE DUSTER".**

This male continued to struggle, so I loaded the second cartridge as a precaution and shouted, "OFFICER WITH TASER, STOP STRUGGLING OR YOU WILL BE TASERED".

We gained compliance and the male was successfully handcuffed to the rear in a home office approved manner. This male then identified himself as

I work as a security guard and at the time of the events detailed in this statement I was providing security at BREEZE NIGHTCLUB, EASTERN PROMENADE, PORTHCAWL. At approximately 22:30 hours it was starting to pick up and was getting quite busy in the club. I was inside the main part of the club. The only other thing I can remember about this male was that he was a little shorter than me, say around 5'10" maybe. I would possibly recognise him again but I am not certain. My attention was drawn to him because he had approached a couple besides the bar and the female of the couple had pushed herself between this male and her partner saying "CAN YOU GO AWAY". The male refused so I went over and intervened. I took the male downstairs to talk to him as it was too loud in the main part of the club. On the way down the stairs, this male showed a bit of aggression towards me by puffing his chest up, throwing his arms about and speaking with a very aggressive tone in his voice. took the male in the yellow t-shirt to a van. I then heard a commotion down by the road, so I turned and saw about 5 police officers running down towards the entrance to MANSELS CHIPSHOP, which is just around the corner from the BREEZE NIGHTCLUB. I walked out in to the road to see what was happening as there were a lot of police vans there blocking my view. I observed the male in the white top with red stipes being arrested by a male officer. The officer was standing behind the male in the white t-shirt with the red stripes and he was holding the male's hands behind his back so I assumed the male was being handcuffed. At this point I saw the male get away from the police officer. I started to run down to offer assistance but then heard someone shout "TASER, TASER, TASER" so I stopped. I watched a police officer pointing a TASER at the male in the white top with red stripes and fire it. It didn't seem to have any effect on the male who started kicking his legs at the TASER officers face. The male in the white top with red stripes was flinging his legs high up towards the officer. I think he may have made contact with the officer with one kick but it looked as if the officer managed to deflect it away with his arm.

By this time, the male was in the middle of the road, there was a female officer there with blonde hair who was trying to keep the males mates away as they were becoming quite verbal and encroaching on the situation. I was only about 10 feet away so decided that I had to take some action to help the police officers so I ran over and tried to grab the male's waist. An officer also took hold of the male by the back of his shirt and bent the male forward so he went to the ground. The male was face down to the ground with his knees tucked up in to his chest so he was in a strong position from which he could stand back up. I pulled his feet backwards so that he was flat on the ground. I then restrained his legs. The male in the white top with red stripes was trying to struggle but now there were 2 officers, me and restraining him. A police officer came over to take over from me. As I was getting back up I heard the female officer shout something about a knuckle duster. I saw a knuckle duster laying on the road about 3 feet away from where he was being restrained and in the spot he was when I first got involved. Also on the road were parts from the TASER and its wires, a torch and a pen. The police took the male over to the wall by GRIFFIN PARK. At this time the male was fully handcuffed. I stood by the knuckleduster and the parts of the TASER. I pulled the wires out of the road so that traffic wouldn't drive over them. I started to divert traffic away from the bits on the floor but I then heard the male in the white top with the red stripes start to kick off again. He was kicking himself off the wall and pushing against the 2 officers detaining him. The female officer was leaning in to him with her arms outstretched shouting "STAY THERE" and pushing him back against the wall. I went over to help and together we put on him on to the ground. A police van then arrived with a further 2 officers.

The male was not co-operating and there was no way we could allow him to stand back up to get him to the van. He was struggling with immense strength, more than I had experience of him earlier on and if he was allowed to get to his feet he would have used this against us. He was also spitting blood and we didn't want him at eye level. Four of us; myself, and 2 male police officers carried the male in the white top with the red stripes to the back of the van, keeping him face down, although he was still turning his head and trying to spit up at us. The male was placed lying down on his left side in the rear of the van. He tried kicking out as soon as he was put down in there but the door was shut quickly to prevent him kicking anyone. I am Inspector Naomi Drew of the South Wales Police, I am currently stationed at Bridgend Police Station in the Community Safety Department. I have been in this role since July 2015, part of my remit includes licensing for Bridgend and the Vale of Glamorgan, working with my team and licensed premises to ensure that the licensing objectives are complied with.

When breaches of a premises license are brought to my attention, it is always my initial intention to work alongside the premises in question to attempt to rectify the situation, prior to any enforcement action being considered.

On the 8th June 2016, I had cause to send a warning and advice letter to Mr Patrick Charles George EVANS, Premises Licence Holder and Mr Karl SVENSEN, Designated Premises Supervisor of the Cabin Bar & Breeze Night Club, Coney Beach, Eastern Promenade, Porthcawl. In this letter I outlined the circumstances concerning a serious disturbance which took place outside the premises on the 30th April 2016, whereby both Police Officers and a member of the public were assaulted. Subsequently two individuals who had been customers in the premises were arrested.

Officers investigating this incident had made 5 separate requests for CCTV footage to be provided, despite these requests the footage was not provided.

I further referenced an incident which occurred on the 3rd April where an offence of Grievous Bodily Harm was recorded. On this occasion there was a delay in providing CCTV footage, thus impeding the investigation of a serious offence.

At the conclusion of this letter I reiterated the importance and onus on the premises to be diligent when serving and admitting customers to the premises.

On the 12th July 2016, I had cause to send a second warning letter to Mr EVANS and Mr SVENSEN regarding the Cabin Bar & Breeze Nightclub, Coney Beach, Eastern Promenade, Porthcawl. This letter was sent in relation to an assault which occurred at the Breeze nightclub on Saturday 2nd July 2016. Disappointingly and despite the previous letter a month before, the manageress was unable to provide CCTV images when requested. I concluded this letter by admonishing the premises to take appropriate steps to reduce the number of alcohol related occurrences and to comply with the conditions of their authorisation.

In order to promote the licensing objectives and to work with the premises I instructed PC ELLIS to arrange a meeting with the Mr EVANS & Mr SVENSEN. As with other premises I have worked with, it was suggested that the meeting take place at Bridgend Police Station. This has never been a cause for contention in my experience with other licensed premises across the Borough. I was therefore somewhat surprised when I received a response stating that it would not be appropriate to meet in the Police Station. It was suggested that we should instead attend at the venue in order to view the CCTV system. Taking into consideration the fact that I was not disputing their system and that the footage previously requested was outside of their retention period and therefore no longer available, there was no value to attending. A meeting was however convened at Bridgend Police Station, Brackla Street, Bridgend at 09.30hrs on Wednesday the 10th August 2016. Present at this meeting were Mr SVENSEN, Ms Fave BAYLISS who is employed at the premises and PC 2458 ELLIS and PC 5102 ROWLATT. licensing Officers for Bridgend. The meeting started by discussing the issues surrounding non production of CCTV in relation to the above two letters. Unfortunately it was not possible to reach agreement as Mr SVENSEN disputed the evidence before him and any subsequent breaches. As the meeting progressed Mr SVENSEN alluded to the fact that he feels he is receiving unfair treatment from South Wales Police and that the issues I referred to had not happened at this premises. At this point I felt it relevant and pertinent to remind Mr SVENSEN of a previous meeting held at Bridgend Police Station on the 4th August 2015, where a number of violent incidents concerning alcohol related crime and disorder were discussed and advice was given on the management of such incidents.

It is both disappointing and concerning that despite warning and advice letters being sent, and meeting in person to discuss the issues, and to reinforce the licensing conditions, the advice offered has not been heeded. Having tried to engage and work with the premises, I now consider that the only option left in order to ensure the premises works towards its licensing objectives of The Prevention of Crime and Disorder, Public Safety and The Prevention of Public Nuisance, is to seek to take enforcement action.



AND IN THE MATTER OF CABIN BAR AND BREEZE NIGHTCLUB

WITNESS STATEMENT OF KARL SVENSON

- 1. My name is Karl Svenson and I acquired the lease of The Cabin Bar on 31st October 2014.
- 2. As of the 31st October 2014, I became the Designated Premises Supervisor.
- 3. Further to the acquisition of the lease, I subsequently refurbished the first floor of the premises and opened 'Breeze Nightclub and Function Suite' in July 2015.
- 4. I have managed several licenced premises over the last twenty years as 'DPS'.
- 5. I have an impeccable record of complying with all requirements and stipulations related to licenced premises
- 6. I currently employ fifteen members of staff at the venue, including a manageress.
- 7. All members of staff receive comprehensive training and support to ensure that they comply fully with licencing laws and operate in a safe manner (KS/1).
- 8. It has been surprising and saddening that South Wales Police are reviewing the premises licence of The Cabin Bar and Breeze Nightclub, given my willingness to cooperate and my continuous efforts to try and maintain a positive working relationship with South Wales Police.
- 9. I will deal with each of the allegations in order:

Licencing Objectives

"There are numerous, persistent and an unacceptable number of incidents, many of these occurrences have resulted in injury to customers, some severe, where alcohol has played a prominent part"

- 10. In recent months, the number of incidents at the venue has declined, this is as a result of the consistency and hard work of the Door Supervisors in adopting a zero tolerance approach to antisocial behaviour and the bar staff's vigilance when dispensing alcohol to customers.
- 11. We keep a comprehensive record of all incidents that occur on the premises.
- 12. Since January 2016, there have been only four recorded incidents (KS/2):
 - a. 16th April 2016
 - b. 22nd April 2016
 - c. 19th June 2016
 - d. 29th July 2016
- 13. Of these incidents, only one (22nd April 2016) resulted in injury to a customer/member of the public.
- 14. Violent behaviour is not tolerated and we always aim to prevent any such incidents occurring.

"Customers have had to be forcibly handcuffed, whilst one was so violent that he had to be subdued with a taser weapon i.e what is commonly referred to as 'tasered'"

- 15. It is inevitable, given the nature of the business that occasionally the police will need to detain members of the public.
- 16. In relation to this specific incident (1st August 2016), we challenge the description of the event that has been put forward by South Wales Police.
- 17. A member of the public was refused entrance to the premises. He was found to have a substance on him who the Door Supervisor's believed could be illegal drugs.
- 18. It is acknowledged that he could have been a potential customer, he did not, in fact, enter our premises.
- 19. He was arrested more than 150 yards from the premises and the premises' security staff supported South Wales Police in detaining the individual

"In the last few months a number of police officers summoned to deal with disturbances have also been assaulted"

- 20. It is acknowledged that there have been two incidents where police officers have been injured in the vicinity of the venue.
- 21. The first incident (1st August 2016) could have been prevented. The Security Officers who were on duty at the premises assisted the police to put a member of the public to the floor. They were then ordered to release him which subsequently resulted in him causing injury to the police officer.
- 22. We are aware of a second incident involving two female police officers at the entrance to Eastern Promenade.
- 23. This was again a situation where the premises' security staff assisted the police in detaining an individual.
- 24. We have no written incident log as the incident did not happen at our premises or in the immediate vicinity.
- 25. The individual involved had not entered the premises and our security staff confirmed this to the police at the time.
- 26. We made available our CCTV footage to South Wales Police but the incident was too far away and, as a result, there was no evidence which assisted.

"The most serious offences have been committed under the Licencing Act 2003"

27. Given the wide range of offences which this Act covers, a further breakdown of the offences would assist in our understanding of the Police's allegations against the premises.

"Similarly, serious offences have been detected under other legislation which is appended to the Applicant".

28. We would reiterate that clarification of such allegations is required in order for us to fully address matters.

"In fact, the list of incidents associated with the premises highlights that it has an extended history of violence and disorder"

- 29. As a venue, we work tirelessly to ensure that we operate in a manner which ensures the safety of both our customers and our staff.
- 30. In recent months, the number of incidents at the venue has decreased. This is as a result of the consistency and hard work of the Door Supervisors in fostering a zero tolerance approach to antisocial behaviour and the bar staff's vigilance when dispensing alcohol to customers.

"These occurrences and offences recorded to date are totally unacceptable and even if they were to remain constant a review is warranted, however, they have increased since 2014 and will increase further unless drastic changes take place"

- 31. We challenge that incidents will increase further unless drastic changes take place. As already explained there has been a decline in disorderly incidents at the venue in recent months.
- 32. Staff have received, and will continue to receive, extensive training in order to minimise any incidents of alcohol related disturbances. It should be acknowledged that prior to my acquiring the lease for this venue, it was in a very poor state of repair and subsequently held a small number customers. It was often shut by 9p.m in the evening.
- 33. Due to the vast improvement in the building and facilities of the venue, the volume of customers will naturally increase. Unfortunately this can result in an increase in anti-social behaviour which we are constantly working hard to reduce.
- 34. There have not been any incidents at the venue for over three months. This has been during our busiest time, including the Elvis weekend.

"Since Karl Svenson became DPS in late 2014 and the nightclub reopened in July 2015 having been unused for a number of years as it had fallen into disrepair, there has been an increase in alcohol related violence, crime and disorder"

35. As outlined at paragraphs 33-34, the improvement in the premises has had a knock-on effect in increasing customer footfall and therefore increasing the possibility of incidents of antisocial behaviour. We continue to work hard to reduce such incidents.

"Additionally the licencing objectives have been further and seriously undermined by events during the Elvis Festival"

- 36. Further clarification is required in relation to the events alleged by South Wales Police.
- 37. Elvis Weekend was a successful weekend for the venue, even though footfall had significantly increased as a result of the event, there were no reported incidents of any type at the premises.

"From 2015 up to and including September 2016 numerous occurrences have been reported many of which have subsequently been recorded as criminal offences"

- 38. It is acknowledged that there have been occasions where criminal offences have been committed, it should be noted that there have been incidents where one member of the public has been charged with several offences.
- 39. We suggest that the list is somewhat skewed as a result of not being related to specific incidents, to show the exact number of incidents relate to such offences.

Theft

- 40. We are unaware of any incidents of theft directly related to our venue or our customers.
- 41. We can recall one occasion where a customer alleged her mobile telephone had been stolen and myself, along with and an amount of the subsequently interviewed at Bridgend Custody Suite.
- 42. No further action was taken in respect of this offence.

Sexual Assault

- 43. We are unaware of any incidents of sexual assault at our premises.
- 44. Officers from South Wales Police attended the premises and sifted through over three hours of CCTV footage with the assistance of

- 45. It was concluded by the Police Officer in attendance that the offence in question happened at a premises with 'steel stairs' which this venue does not have.
- 46. The officer therefore acknowledged that the incident could not have taken place at The Cabin Bar/Breeze Nightclub.

Possession of Class A, B and C Drugs

- 47. The venue has a strong anti-drugs ethos and conducts frequent searches of a wide cross-section of customers.
- 48. A female Door Supervisor has been employed in order to ensure that both male and female customers can be searched.
- 49. Although we frequently conduct searches we have not found any customers with drugs since December 2015.
- 50. Prior to this date, four people were refused entry to the premises on separate occasions (KS/5):
 - a. 1st August 2015
 - b. 7th August 2015
 - c. 28th August 2015
 - d. 18th December 2015.
- 51. As a venue, we endeavour to eliminate all instances of possession of illegal substances but again, due to the nature of the business, this will always be a challenge, however, it is a challenge that all similar venues will face and we continue to be vigilant and ensure our staff are appropriately trained.

Offences under the Private Security Act

- 52. Further clarification is required in order to ensure we are in a position to address these points.
- 53. In relation to the Elvis Weekend, the premises licence states: "The premises licence holder will ensure that two SIA registered supervisors are employed at the premises on Fridays and Saturdays from 2200 hours until closure" and "The premises licence holder will ensure that two SIA registered supervisors are employed at the premises on the Saturday only of the 'Elvis Weekend' from 1400 until closure.

- 54. Both of these conditions were fully satisfied and, in fact, the number of registered SIA registered supervisors exceeded the mandatory number at all times.
- 55. Our attention was drawn to an incident where a member of staff incorrectly signed the premises supervisor 'signing in' log. The member of staff in question has been spoken to and disciplinary proceedings have been instigated (KS/6)

"It is also significant that customers have become very violent and many have been so intoxicated on arrest that custody officers have had to conduct regular 30 minute welfare visits to the cells to monitor their demeanour"

"Custody records detail that prisoners are still drunk many hours after arrest and visits have taken place from the commencement of their detention until their release many hours after their arrival at the police station".

- 56. As previously explained, all of our staff are highly trained in order to identify customers that have consumed too much alcohol. We are concerned that customers to whom we have refused entry because of their levels of intoxication, are subsequently engaging in alcohol related crime and are being linked to our premises even though they have been refused entry.
- 57. Furthermore, when arrests are made in the vicinity it is worth noting that there are several venues positioned within a small radius.

Engagement

"South Wales Police have engaged in different approaches to promote the licencing objectives including warning/advice letters and meetings. There has, in fact, been two letters served recently.

There was also a failed attempt by the police to convene a meeting at Bridgend Police Station in July 2016 to address matters.

However; the two meetings which have taken place as well as the letters served have had no impact and incidents involving drunken, violent customers as well as other serious occurrences continue to be recorded. "

58. The initial meeting in August of last year addressed concerns regarding incidents relating to the venue. Although it is stated that there were incidents on the 8th, 9th, 16th, 28th and 29th August 2015, this was soon after the meeting.

- 59. The number of incidents at the venue has consistently declined since we opened in July 2015 and there have been no recorded incidents since July 2016.
- 60. It was alleged that the venue had failed to provide CCTV, however, historically, the venue has provided CCTV many times to the police and o occasions remained at the venue until the early hours of the morning in order to ensure the police retrieve evidence as promptly as possible.
- 61. This has also resulted in additional members of staff being paid in order to attend the venue and extract CCTV to a memory stick.
- 62. The CCTV which we have on site is a system which cost around £7,500.00. It has extensive coverage of both inside and outside the venue and features a high quality picture.
- 63. I was unaware that the police required any CCTV footage and, as I explained at the meeting, have never withheld any CCTV from the police. In the past I have gone above and beyond in order to ensure the police receive access to CCTV footage in a timely manner.
- 64. During the meeting a plan was put in place in order ensure there is now a single point of contact for when CCTV is required by the police. This will ensure that there is no further confusion in the future.
- 65. There have been no further issues regarding CCTV since the meeting with the police.
- 66. It is disputed that there were failed attempts to convene a meeting. This was not due to Mr Evans' unwillingness and South Wales Police were invited to attend the venue but this failed to materialise.
- 67. A meeting did take place between myself and South Wales Police.
- 68. There was no refusal to attend the meeting by any party, only a suggestion for the meeting to be held at the premises rather than at the police station.

"Despite the meeting, serious matters were subsequently evidenced during a joint-agency enforcement operation at the Porthcawl Elvis Weekend in September 2016"

- 69. Again, we would request further information as to the allegations which are being put forward by the police regarding the Elvis Weekend.
- 70. We have outlined the requirements of the premises licence at paragraph 53.

Warning/advice letters served on the licence holder and DPS by South Wales Police

"The incident again highlighted that a customer's intake of alcohol was excessive and played a significant part in the assault.

At 02:03 hours on Saturday 23rd July 2016 (Friday trading) customers became involved in a disturbance upon leaving causing officers to alight from a vehicle and intervene in an attempt to part the factions.

Sergeant 4717 Davies was taken to the ground where he was punched in the face by a customer who, after a struggle, was eventually arrested and handcuffed. He was very intoxicated."

71. I raise the same concerns that it is difficult to be certain that they had, in fact, been inside our premises and had not been refused entry due to their level of intoxication There are numerous licenced premises in the vicinity and it should be noted that the location of our premises is at a through route for people walking from the town centre venues and returning to Trecco Bay. With this in mind, it cannot always be attributed that individuals who have consumed too much alcohol and who are situated outside our venue have necessarily been one of our customers.

"These concerns are strengthened given that the advice and warnings have been given and meetings held, yet there continues to be a failure to promote the objectives. In fact, the management are in denial of what is regularly occurring."

- 72. Only one of the meetings held referred to alcohol related incidents and this was over 12 months ago. Since that meeting there have been no concerns raised, other than an issue regarding CCTV which was concluded by both parties disagreeing with the events which resulted in the CCTV not being provided.
- 73. A way forward was agreed with regards to the provision of CCTV in the future and there have been no subsequent issues.
- 74. Had I been made aware of the concerns which have now been raised by South Wales Police, then I would have ensured that I worked with the police and licencing in order to overcome any difficulties.
- 75. I am concerned, with the exception of the meeting which was held on 14th August 2015, that no concerns regarding alcohol related incidents have been raised with me or with the premises holder.
- 76. We seek to work in collaboration with South Wales Police and to foster a positive working relationship. In order to so then it is essential that we have an open and honest dialogue.

- 77. It is frustrating that rather than address these issues with me, you have taken the step to review the premises licence.
- 78. Further confusion is added by the agreement on the 8th September 2016 to grant two Temporary Event Notices (TEN) allowing me to remain open until 4am on 24th September 2016 (Saturday trading Elvis Weekend) and also the same hours for the forthcoming Boxing night (26th December 2016).
- 79. In light of the incidents which are alleged to have taken place at the premises, then this I find it difficult to comprehend the authorisation of the TENs.
- 80. Throughout the allegations, there have been common themes which relate to the difficulty in determining where members of the public have been consuming alcohol prior to offences being committed.
- 81. Furthermore, it has been highlighted that some incidents have occurred as a result of individuals being refused entry because they are too intoxicated. We cannot take responsibility for individuals who have consumed alcohol at other venues.
- 82. As a venue, we have a comprehensive set of documents to certify that we work effectively and safely in order to ensure the well-being of staff and customers alike. These include:
 - a. Training Manuals
 - b. Health and Safety Risk Assessments
 - c. Fire Safety Records
 - d. Prevention of Underage Drinking and Drug and Alcohol Violation
 - e. Challenge 21 Policy
 - f. Tool Box Talk Scheme
 - g. Incident Logs
- 83. It should be noted that since November 2014, the Cabin Bar has experienced an exceptionally small number of incidents, only two of which have required the attendance of the Police.
- 84. I disagree with some of the statements which have been put forward by South Wales Police in respect of the premises but it is evident that there do need to be changes made to further ensure the safety of customers, staff and the wider public. With this in mind, we have considered a number of 'Action Points':
 - a. Staff training to continue to be a vital part of ensuring customer and public safety;
 - b. From this weekend, two SIA approved Security Officers will assist in the dispersion of customers once the venue has closed with the aim of eliminating any incidents.

c. Upon reviewing the time it takes customers to disperse following the closure of the premises, it is clear that there is often a lack of taxis available and in light of this, we have engaged with PD Travel, who have agreed to provide taxis from the venue on Friday and Saturday nights from 11pm onwards.








IN THE MATTER OF AN APPLICATION FOR REVIEW OF A PREMISES LICENCE UNDER S.51 OF THE LICENCING ACT 2003

AND IN THE MATTER OF CABIN BAR AND BREEZE NIGHTCLUB

WITNESS STATEMENT OF PATRICK EVANS

- 1. The family have owned the freehold to the Cabin Bar since 1979.
- 2. Until last year, the licence was tendered out and the licence ran alongside any tenancy.
- 3. There were several individuals who had managed the premises over the years.
- 4. I have held the premises licence without any significant incident and there has always been an excellent working relationship with the police.
- 5. I do not seek to address specific issues in this statement as I am not at the premises on a day-to-day basis.
- 6. I have always been willing to cooperate and to assist when the police required. For example, I have been approached for CCTV footage on a number of occasions, as my CCTV cameras cover a very wide area.
- Page 97. I even assisted in providing CCTV footage for a murder which took place last year in Trecco Bay.

- 8. The Eastern Promenade is a thoroughfare from the town centre. When all of the venues in town are closing, people use this as a walking route to Trecco Bay Caravan Park. Locals also use it as a route home.
- 9. As the Cabin Bar is the only venue with a late licence, it is always a final port-of-call for those who have been drinking elsewhere. I have always had complete faith in the door security staff to refuse entry to those individuals who should not be in the premises.
- 10. With regards to the meeting which was suggested by South Wales Police, I would like to clarify that there was never a refusal to attend.
- 11. I suggested that it might be more appropriate to meet at the venue itself, in order to discuss any issues and so that if access to CCTV was required, then it could be provided at the time.
- 12. This request was not answered.
- 13. I am aware that Karl Svenson has been approached on occasion to provide CCTV footage and that he has always complied with such requests. I have no reason to believe that he would have refused on this occasion.
- 14. The police are aware of the coverage that my CCTV system has and I can confirm that no request was made to me to obtain any CCTV footage from my systems.
- 15. I have an excellent working relationship with Karl Svenson and have complete trust in him to operate Page 98 the venue in accordance to all licencing laws.

Moreover the annual lease granted to him requires [the Tenant] to "take all reasonable and necessary steps to maintain the Premises licence"

- 16. His desire to run the venue in accordance to legislation has been evidenced by the low number of incidents which have occurred at the premises since he took over.
- 17. He has invested in the premises and has undertaken to renovate it to a very high standard. This has an effect in attracting the right sort of customers.
- 18. We have been considering entering into formal discussions with the council and police regarding opening the old function suite which is adjacent to the Cabin Bar. Obviously operating our venues to a high standard of safety is important and this is something which we would seek to foster in any future business venture of licenced premises.
- 19. We would be seeking to employ at least 30 people if the function suite re-opens and obviously any impact on our licence could have a knock on effect for such future employment, as well as for the individuals who are already employed by Karl Svenson at the Cabin Bar.
- 20. I would seek a detailed breakdown of all allegations which are being put forward by South Wales Police with regards to the review of the premises licence to ensure that they understand that some allegations relate to the same incidents.
