A service history was provided dated 10 August 2014 with the mileage being reported at 25,275, the 24 April 2016 at 42,882, 22 February 2017 at 51,669 and 17 November 2018 at 76,128.

The Team Manager Licensing asked Mr Brain for any further background on the vehicle.

Mr Brain explained that the vehicle was originally constructed for carrying goods. Before he bought it, the vehicle was converted into a passenger vehicle. He explained that the converters did this in 2012 shortly before he purchased.

A service history was provided dated 21 June 2013 with the mileage recorded at 21,559, 27 February 2015 at 42,277, 7 October 2017 at 61,739 and 24 January 2019 at 79,419.

The Team Manager Licensing asked Mr Brain for any further background on the vehicle.

Mr Brain explained that the vehicle came directly from the NHS. The vehicle was converted when it was new. Mr Brain explained that he tried to obtain further information from the company who performed the conversion but as they had a new system since 2012, many of the records had been lost.

Members noted that it fell outside of policy 2.1 due to the age and mileage.

The application was made by Andrew Thomas, Brynmenyn, Bridgend to licence a Dacia Logan MCV Ambiance, vehicle registration number CK64 WTP as a Hackney Carriage vehicle to seat 4 persons. The vehicle was pre-owned and was first registered at the DVLA on 4 January 2015.

The Sub-Committee inspected the vehicle.

The Team Manager Licensing advised members that the current mileage of the vehicle was 48,745 miles. She stated that the application fell outside the Hackney Carriage Vehicle Policy approved by the Licensing Committee for the reasons outlined in the report.

She advised Members that the vehicle was not wheelchair accessible.

Mr Thomas advised that the vehicle was acquired by himself in February 2019 however the vehicle had been suspended as a licenced taxi vehicle since August 2018 as it failed to appear for inspection.

Mr Thomas added that he acquired the vehicle damaged, with many issues with the bodywork. He said that the vehicle had signs of major water damage, as the vehicle must have been stationary for a number of months with water entering the vehicle.

The Team Manager Licensing asked Mr Thomas to explain why the mileage is different now compared to when it was previously licenced.

Mr Thomas explained that the ECU in the current car was damaged, presumably from the water damage. He decided to try to replace it with a used ECU from another vehicle to see if it worked, to which it did.

The Team Manager Licensing asked Mr Thomas if he knew that the particular car had a manufacturer recall and if he knew what it was for

Mr Thomas was aware of the recall but was not sure what it was for.

RESOLVED: The decision read as follows:

"The Committee have considered your application to licence a Dacia Logan registration number CK64 WTP. The Committee have inspected the vehicle and are not satisfied that the vehicle is in exceptional condition both in its interior and exterior. There are a number of dents on the exterior and rust in the interior from water damage. The

Committee are not satisfied that the vehicle offers an exceptional standard of safety as the vehicle is subject to an outstanding recall from Dacia and the general condition of the vehicle is poor. After considering the Statement of Licensing Policy the Committee have determined that the vehicle does not meet the requirements of first registration and does not meet the exceptions in terms of condition of the vehicle and on that basis have determined not to grant the licence."

1.1 The purpose of this report is to ask the sub-committee to consider an application to grant a licence for a hackney carriage vehicle.

2.1 There is no direct link to the Corporate Plan / Other Corporate Priorities.

# 3. Background

3.1 It is the duty of the Local Authority to determine applications made under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 and Town Police Clauses Act 1847. Applications which fall outside the policy guidelines are referred to a Licensing Sub-Committee for determination.

# 4. Current situation/proposal

- 4.1 Application is made by Paul Brain, Peyton Travel Limited of Bridgend to licence a Dacia Logan vehicle registration number LF17 WZM as a hackney carriage vehicle to seat 4 persons.
- 4.2 The vehicle was first registered at the DVLA on 31 March 2017.
- 4.3 The application falls outside the Hackney Carriage Vehicle Policy approved by the Licensing Committee. The vehicle is not wheelchair accessible. For Members' information a service report for the vehicle has been submitted dated 12 December 2018 with the mileage recorded at 11882.
- 4.4 On 17 December 2019 this same application was put before the Licensing Sub-Committee who resolved to refuse the application due to safety concerns in relation to the rear seats.
- 4.5 On 18 December 2019 Licensing Enforcement Officers; Andrew Brown and David Barrett inspected a similar vehicle situated at a local car dealership; a 2017 Docia Logan.

The Licensing Enforcement Officers checked the rear seats of this vehicle and found that when they were locked into place they were very secure with no quality or safety concerns. They did however comment that if you fold down the rear seats, the rear seat belts hang in front of the red metal seat fixing loops. If you try to put the seats back into place without firstly lifting the rear seat belts out of the way the seat catch

cannot engage the loop (because the belt is in the way) and the seat will not click back into place properly. This could therefore give the impression that the seat is loose.

Pictures of the inspected vehichle can be found in *Appendix A*.

# 4.6 Policy Guidelines

The vehicle policy applicable to this application was approved by the Licensing Committee on 10 March 2008. The relevant extract from the policy is as follows:

"(Policy 2.1) Applications for the first licensing of a hackney carriage or private hire vehicle should be submitted to the Council within 14 days of the first registration of the vehicle at the DVLA. The mileage at the time of application should be no greater than 500 miles. The applicant may be the second or a subsequent registered keeper but the applicant must demonstrate that there is no more than 14 days between the first registration and transfer to the applicant's name. Applications will normally be dealt with under the Scheme of Delegation to Officers.

(Policy 2.2) Applications for the first licensing of vehicles falling outside the above policy guidelines will normally be refused but a relaxation of the policy may be considered in exceptional circumstances. The general guidelines for relaxation of the policy are as follows but each case will be dealt with on its merits:



#### 1. Purpose of report

- 1.1 The purpose of this report is to ask the sub-committee to consider an application to grant a licence for a hackney carriage vehicle.
- 2. Connection to corporate improvement objectives/other corporate priorities
- 2.1 There is no direct link to the Corporate Plan / Other Corporate Priorities.

# 3. Background

3.1 It is the duty of the Local Authority to determine applications made under the Local Government (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act 1976 and Town Police Clauses Act 1847. Applications which fall outside the policy guidelines are referred to a Licensing Sub-Committee for determination.

# 4. Current situation/proposal

- 4.1 Application is made by Emma Parrott of Porthcawl to licence a Toyota Avensis vehicle registration number MD66 WXJ as a hackney carriage vehicle to seat 4 persons.
- 4.2 The vehicle was first registered at the DVLA on 31 January 2017.
- 4.3 The application falls outside the Hackney Carriage Vehicle Policy approved by the Licensing Committee. The vehicle is not wheelchair accessible. For Members' information a service report for the vehicle has been submitted dated 8 July 2018 with the mileage recorded at 17357 and 10 September 2019 with the mileage at 31925.
- 4.4 On 17 December 2019 this same application was put before the Licensing Sub-Committee who resolved to refuse the application due to safety concerns in relation to the rear seats.
- 4.5 On 8 January 2020 Licensing Enforcement Officer; Andrew Brown inspected a similar vehicle situated at a local car dealership; a 2018 Toyota Avensis.

The Licensing Enforcement Officer checked the rear seats of this vehicle and found that when the seats are pushed down the side seat belts hang to the side of the seat locking hook, when the seats are firmly pushed back (making sure the seat belts are not dragged in front of the securing hook) the seats are very secure with no quality or safety concerns. It was noted by the Licensing Enforcement Officer that the rear

side belts could be inadvertently dragged in front of the securing hook when pushing the seat back into an upright position, causing a locking problem.

Pictures of the inspected vehicle can be found in *Appendix A*.

#### 4.6 Policy Guidelines

The vehicle policy applicable to this application was approved by the Licensing Committee on 10 March 2008. The relevant extract from the policy is as follows:

"(Policy 2.1) Applications for the first licensing of a hackney carriage or private hire vehicle should be submitted to the Council within 14 days of the first registration of the vehicle at the DVLA. The mileage at the time of application should be no greater than 500 miles. 


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
