APPLICATION FOR A VARIATION OF PREMISES LICENCE

MARMARIS KEBAB AND PIZZA, 33 WYNDHAM STREET, BRIDGEND

1. Purpose of report

- 1.1 This is an application made by Fatih Yildiztekin, premises licence holder, to vary a premises licence in force at the above-mentioned premises.
- 1.2 This application must be determined by a sub-committee as relevant representations have been received from the South Wales Police.
- 1.3 At the time this report was prepared, the licensing authority had not received confirmation from all parties that a hearing of this application would not be necessary.
- 1.4 The legislation provides for the promotion of the four statutory licensing objectives which must be addressed by the authority when licensing functions are undertaken:

The prevention of crime and disorder
Public safety
The prevention of public nuisance
The protection of children from harm.

2. Connection to corporate improvement objectives/other corporate priorities

- 2.1 There is no direct link to the Corporate Improvement Plan / Other Corporate Priority.

3. Background

- 3.1 A copy of the application form is attached at Appendix A.
- 3.2 The applicant seeks to remove conditions 14-19, under Annex 3 of the Premises Licence, which authorises the provision of late night refreshment from the premises.
- 3.3 The conditions all relate to the removal of the requirement of SIA registered doorstaff at the premises.
- 3.4 A copy of the current premises licence is attached at Appendix B.
- 3.5 The application has been advertised in accordance with Regulations.

4. Current situation/proposal

- 4.1 Representations have been received from the South Wales Police and are attached at Appendix C.
- 4.2 The Sub-Committee must have regard to the Council's Statement of Licensing Policy and the Home Office Guidance issued under Section 182 of the Licensing Act 2003. However, the Sub-Committee must consider each application on its own merits having regard to the application, the operating schedule submitted and the representations made.
- 4.3 Sections 2 (The Licensing Objectives), 8.74 (Full Variation process), 9 (Determining applications) and 10 (Conditions attached to premises licences) of the Home Office Guidance apply to this application.
- 4.4 When determining this application, the Sub-Committee must undertake its functions in accordance with the four statutory licensing objectives:
- The prevention of crime and disorder;
 - Public safety;
 - The prevention of public nuisance; and
 - The protection of children from harm.

5. Effect upon policy framework and procedure rules

- 5.1 None

6. Equality Impact Assessment

- 6.1 A full Equality Impact Assessment has not been undertaken in relation to this service, however due regard has been given to the implications on persons protected by equality legislation and human rights. 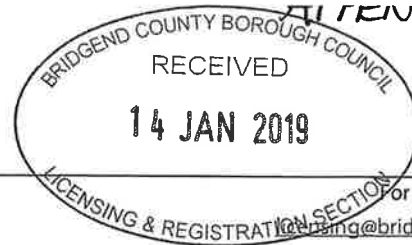

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports – defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or wrestling with one or more martial arts – are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

1. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that at all times customers are asked to respect the surrounding area and to behave in an orderly manner.
2. The Premises Licence Holder shall arrange for the regular clearance of litter within three metres at the front of the premises and two metres either side of the premises every hour - on the hour and at the close of business.
3. The Premises Licence Holder shall retain and maintain the installation of digital CCTV at the premises to the satisfaction of the South Wales Police Crime Reduction Officer. If the CCTV system fails or breaks, it must be replaced within 48 hours.
4. The system shall be maintained at all times the premises remains open to the public.
5. The Premises Licence Holder shall ensure that all aspects of the CCTV system comply with the Data Protection Act 1998 and the guidance issued by the The Office of the Data Protection Supervisor.
6. The Premises Licence Holder shall install CCTV at or near the entrance(s) and exit(s) to the premises and record ingress and egress of customers. CCTV will also be located in all other areas to which the public has access.
7. The Premises Licence Holder will arrange for signs to be placed in a prominent position visible to customers, stating that CCTV is in operation at the premises. The sign must show the controllers contact details.
8. Signage will be approved by the Crime Reduction Officer.
9. There will be a storage facility of CCTV images of up to 31 days covering the maximum number of days in a calendar month.
10. The Premises Licence Holder must make recordings of images available on request to any officer of the South Wales Police in the course of their duties as soon as is reasonably practicable. Therefore adequate training will have to be provided to duty staff in order to comply with this condition.
11. The Premises Licence Holder will be responsible for ensuring that the operating equipment is regularly checked and that it operates at all times during the opening hours.

12. The Premises Licence Holder shall provide and maintain a register to detail any CCTV recordings handed to the South Wales Police in a format approved by the Police. The details of both the person handing over the recordings and the Police Officer receiving them should also be documented.
13. The Premises Licence Holder shall provide a secure room to house the CCTV consul and recording equipment and shall restrict access to the room to designated persons, such persons to be notified in writing to the South Wales Police.
14. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that Two SIA registered Door Supervisors will be employed at the premises from:-
0100 hours Friday to 0400 hours (early Friday morning)
0100 hours Saturday to 0400 hours (early Saturday morning)
0100 hours Sunday to 0400 hours (early Sunday morning)
15. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that two SIA registered Door Supervisors will be employed at the premises from 0100 hours through to 0400 hours (the early hours of Bank Holiday Mondays and all other Bank and Public Holidays).
16. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that a door staff duty register is maintained and completed at the start/end of a shift and will include the SIA licence number, signature and date. It will also detail the name and number of the company/person supplying the staff.
17. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that the door staff register is made available for inspection when requested by an Authorised Officer or Constable.
18. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that nitenet or a similar link radio is utilised from midnight to close of business on Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Sundays preceding Bank Holiday Mondays and days preceding public holidays.
19. Door staff must be clearly identifiable by clothing as well as a visible SIA registration badge as per the terms and conditions of their SIA licence.
20. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that the opening hours are clearly displayed at the entrance and within the premises.
21. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that signage is erected asking patrons not to consume food inside the premises.

22. The Premises Licence Holder will ensure that signage is erected asking patrons not to congregate outside the premises.

- 0100 hours Saturday to 0400 hours (early Saturday morning)
- 0100 hours Sunday to 0400 hours (early Sunday morning)

Under Section 136 it is an offence to: -

A) Carry on or attempt to carry on a licensable activity on or from any premise otherwise than under and in accordance with an authorisation i.e. a premises licence and the conditions which form part of it
OR

B) Knowingly allow a licensable activity to be so carried on

The offences in respect of the above are considered so serious that the penalties are: -
