**61. Bridgend Corporate Parenting Board Annual Report 2023 - 2024**

Decision Made	<p>The Corporate Director - Social Services and Wellbeing presented a report which summarised the progress in Bridgend's children's care and support across the County Borough following the release of the Corporate Parenting Strategy and acknowledging the role of stakeholders both within the council and externally alongside schools and other providers in working towards these aims. The role of a strong partnership with CAMHS was also mentioned as a key component in delivering on the goals and achievements contained within the Annual Report.</p> <p>Councillors posed questions on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Support for kinship carers.</li><li>• Reasons behind multiple moves for care experienced children.</li><li>• The financial status of other authorities/ children being hosted in Bridgend facilities.</li><li>• Youth employability for care-experienced children.</li><li>• The promotion of associated funds for care-experienced children.</li><li>• The number of children from other authorities placed in Bridgend, and the reverse.</li><li>• Clarification on the 47% reduction in multiple placement numbers over the past year.</li><li>• Analysis of any children who are not within the care system but still require assistance, and outcomes associated with those cases.</li><li>• Progress on the Safe Reduction of Care-Experienced Children Strategy's implementation.</li><li>• Attendance of some officers and partners at quarterly Corporate Parenting Board meetings.</li><li>• Comparing Bridgend's numbers of care-experienced children in various settings with other comparable authorities.</li></ul> <p>These questions were addressed by the Deputy Head of Children and Family Services, the Group Manager – Early Years and Young People and the Corporate Director - Social Services and Wellbeing, agreeing to take forward the improvement of youth employability as an ongoing goal to be addressed by the Corporate Parenting Board.</p>
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	<p><b>RESOLVED:</b> The Cabinet Committee endorsed the content of the report, noting additionally that the commitment from officers and partners to the Council in supporting care-experienced children is both inspiring and incredibly important to the success achieved and further progress to be made in future. In addition, it was agreed that the exact numbers of Bridgend young people in other authorities/ locations as well as the number of other authorities' young people in Bridgend locations would be ascertained and returned to the Cabinet Committee.</p> <p>It was further agreed to bring information to the Committee in future on the Inspire Programme and other initiatives supporting care-experienced children as well as the take-up thereof, to gather further information on the reduction in multiple placement numbers, and to pose questions to the South Wales Fire and Rescue Service on their performance metrics in this area upon their upcoming visit to Council.</p>

Decision Made	<p>The Group Manager – Provider Services presented report outlining progress and findings from inspections in care environments across Bridgend County Borough, including Sunny Bank, Harwood House and Golygfa'r Dolydd and providing several recommendations for future progress which have now been addressed with individual location action plans.</p> <p>Councillors asked questions on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Location capacity.</li><li>• Accommodations for out-of-county children in Bridgend locations.</li><li>• Care plan improvements.</li><li>• Required environmental improvements.</li><li>• Potential consolidation of locations.</li><li>• Reasons behind not following procedure and the consequences attached to those decisions.</li><li>• The token economy system mentioned in the report.</li><li>• Notice prior to inspections taken of facilities.</li><li>• The status of staff fitness checks among permanent and agency staff.</li><li>• Officer confidence on implementing recommendations.</li></ul>
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	<p>These queries were answered by the Group Manager – Provider Services, the Corporate Director - Social Services and Wellbeing and the Group Manager – Human Resources and Organisational Development</p> <p><u>RESOLVED:</u> The Cabinet Committee noted the outcomes of the inspections contained within the report and thanked CIW for their inspections.</p>
