#### OMBUDSMAN ANNUAL LETTER

# 1. Purpose of Report

1.1 To provide Members with a copy of the Ombudsman's Annual Letter for 2017/2018.

## 2. Connection to Corporate Improvement Plan / Other Corporate Priority

## 3. Background

3.1 The Ombudsman's Office publishes an Annual Letter detailing, the performance of the Authority against an average for Local Authorities in Wales, and the wider public sector report which contains statistical information about complaints considered in the year.

### 4. Current situation / proposal

- 4.1 The Annual Letter for 2017 / 2018 reports that the number of complaints received by the Ombudsman concerning Bridgend County Borough Council has decreased during this period by 10% from 44 to 40. There were no public interest reports against Bridgend and only 1 case was taken forward for investigation.
- 4.2 The letter notes that complaints regarding Children's Social Services halved from 12 to 6 in the past year. However, particular attention is drawn to the fact that complaints regarding Environment and Environmental Health have increased from 3 to 9.
