I have had the pleasure of holding a surgery this year, which was accompanied by the MS for Bridgend, Sarah Murphy as well as Cllr Elaine Winstanley in Cornelly Community centre.

Due to the amount of people that attended the surgery, it has been decided that a surgery will be held monthly for the residents of Cornelly.

I have submitted a variety of different referrals, throughout this last year, from housing complaints to V2C, potholes and road works. Social services and general upkeep of the village as well.

There have been 52 referrals submitted and all have been concluded covering different aspects, as identified above.

Initiatives and Special Activities

Cornelly Community Council put on a Christmas event, which included a brass band, Santa Claus and a performance from the Cornelly Songbirds.

This year, we have gone into partnership with Adrian Morgan, from the Cornelly Development Trust. We are trying to create a bigger event this year, for the community to enjoy, it is hoped to bring the brass band back again this December. As well as numerous activities and stalls in the Community centre.
