52. Annual Corporate Safeguarding Report 2024/25

Decision Made	<u>RESOLVED:</u> Following detailed consideration and discussions with a Cabinet Member and Senior Officers, the Committee made the following recommendations and request for additional information: Recommendations 1. Members referred to a planning application proposing an expansion to HMP Parc Prison and expressed their concerns regarding the increased pressures this could place on Social Services
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	<p>including the provision of additional social care and supportive arrangements on release including the provision of housing and the possible impact on the safeguarding of inmates. The Committee therefore recommended that the Corporate Director consider responding to the consultation highlighting the additional pressures this could place on the Service.</p> <p>2. The Committee acknowledged the improvements made at HMP Parc Prison to reduce rates of suicide and self-harm and improve relationships between the prison and the Social Services and Wellbeing Directorate and recommended that correspondence be sent to the Governor of the prison recognising the work and seeking clarification on how the prison proposes to continue to maintain and ensure safeguarding of all prisoners should the proposed expansion to the prison be approved and to invite them to attend and speak at a meeting of the Committee regarding safeguarding.</p> <p>3. The Committee expressed concern regarding the significant corporate risk posed by the timescales involved around Digital System Replacement and recognising that the implications are Council-wide, recommended that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> a. the budgetary requirements to deliver the transformation within the tight timescale be quantified and that consideration be given to additional resources being allocated to achieve the transition; b. consideration be given to a dedicated ICT Lead Officer being allocated to the replacement project; c. Members receive an urgent written progress update regarding the transition; and d. that correspondence be sent to Lindsey Phillips inviting her to speak to Members regarding the Welsh Local Government Association's Digital in Social Care Framework which was launched in October 2025 and Bridgend's place within it. <p>4. Members expressed concern that home-educated learners may not have adequate contact with the Local Authority and the Committee were advised that the level is set by National Guidance. The Committee recommended that legal advice be sought as to whether the Guidance can tailored to have increased contact with the learners and ensure they are appropriately safeguarded. The Committee further recommended to refer the matter to the Education and Youth Services Overview and Scrutiny Committee to consider adding the matter to their Forward Work Programme to monitor the situation.</p>
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	Additional Information Requested <p>5. The Committee expressed concern regarding the perceived delay in utilising the £1m non-recurring budget approved by Cabinet to support schools in reducing permanent exclusions and requested an update regarding the use of the funding, when it will be utilised and the proposal being developed in partnership with schools including when it will be considered for decision.</p>

Members were advised that key stakeholders in each community would be consulted on the proposed Strategy and their views sought to shape how the Hubs look in their particular area and the Committee recommended that an all-Member workshop be arranged to allow Councillors to also feed into the Strategy and that local Members are specifically consulted regarding proposed Hubs within their respective Wards.</p> <p>7. The Committee discussed the lack of alignment between education and the Strategy and recommended that consideration be given to the possibility of utilising some of the school estate as potential Hubs and that this aspect be included in the Strategy.</p> <p>Additional Information Requested</p> <p>8. The Committee discussed priority areas within Bridgend and requested a copy of the Regional Partnership Board Strategy which identified the seven priority areas for Bridgend County Borough based on level of need and current service provision.</p>
